

The most current California DMV study on DUI reported **208,531 DUI arrests in 2009**, of which **73% were repeat offenders**. The average cost of incarcerating this population is \$129 per day, costing millions of dollars *each month*. This revolving door is making little impact on the hardcore drunk driving population, and continues to seriously impact public safety.

### Continuous Alcohol Monitoring Case Study: 2009 - 2011

LCA has provided effective continuous alcohol monitoring programs (CAM) for thousands of hardcore drunk drivers throughout California, both pretrial and sentenced.

In 2009, LCA's Riverside County program had a 94% successful completion rate for CAM participants. In 2011, we launched a study to understand the **long-term impact** of these programs on **recidivism** and changing behavior of alcohol-related crimes. We reviewed the California DMV records for 153 CAM participants who completed the program in 2009. These participants had an average of 109 days on the program. We tracked this information over a 22 month period following release from the program, analyzing DUI citations and any other DMV infractions.

### RESULTS and CONCLUSIONS

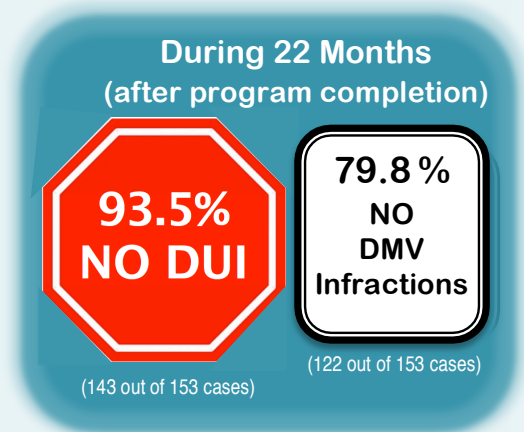
**9 out of 10** participants did not have any DUI citations  
**8 out of 10** did not have **any** DMV infractions

**These results are conclusive.**

Placing hardcore drunk drivers on CAM is an effective, evidence-based alternative confinement program.

These results give county's Community Corrections Partnerships (CCP) an important option to help address the influx of offenders from the **2011 public safety realignment**. LCA CAM programs work to:

- ✓ **Significantly Decrease Recidivism for repeat DUI offenders**
- ✓ **Change Drinking and Driving Behavior**
- ✓ **Enhance Public Safety**
- ✓ **Provide Significant Cost Savings**



**What is CAM?** CAM has been in use nationally since 2003. LCA uses the SCRAMx monitoring ankle bracelet system - the most recognized continuous alcohol monitoring equipment that has successfully monitored more than 170,000 participants nationwide. SCRAMx is **currently in use in over 2,000 Federal, State and Local Courts**.
